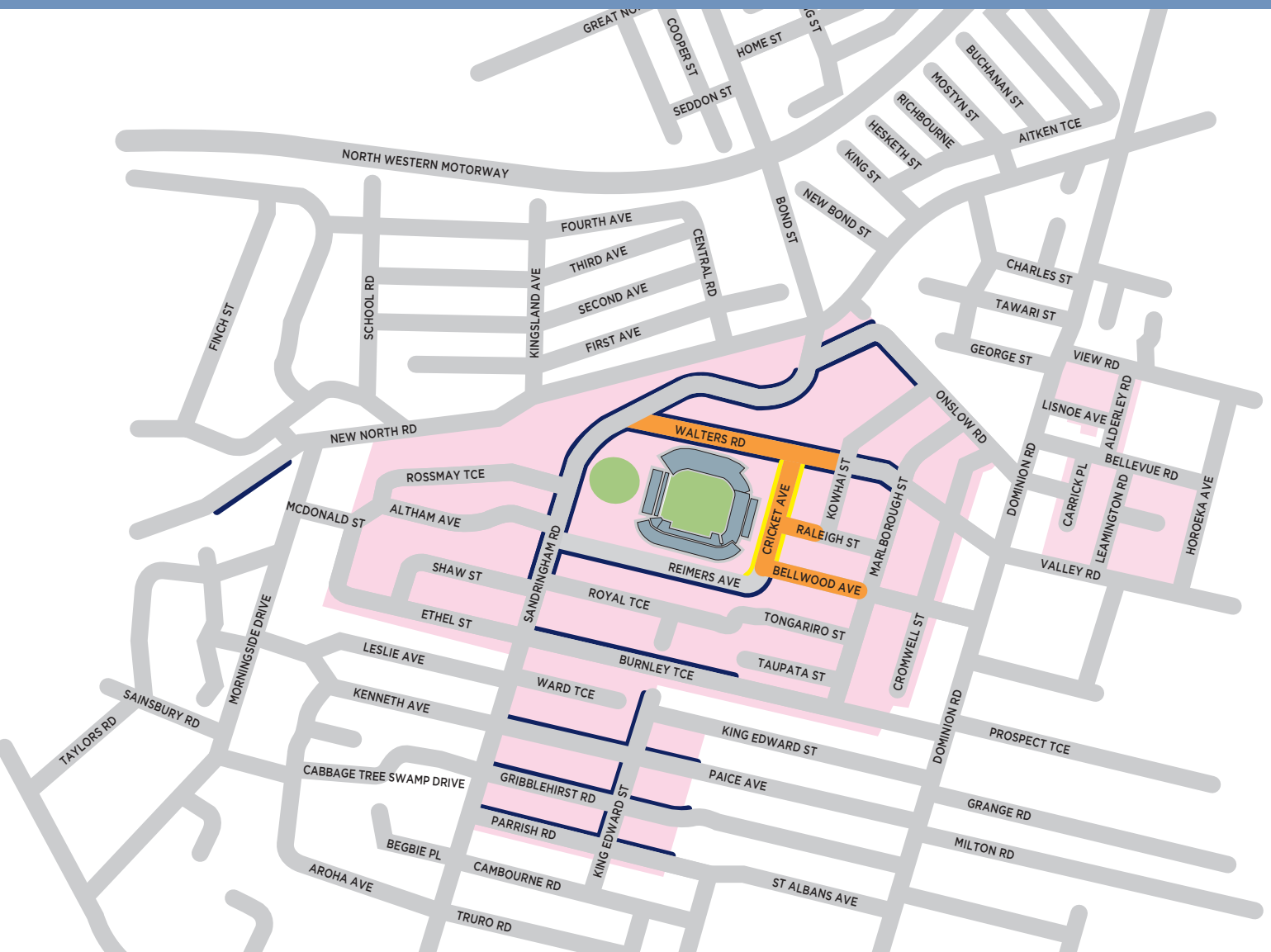
We're excited to host the Blues v Fijian Drua at Eden Park on Saturday 28 March.

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IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Parking Restrictions [5:30pm – 9:30pm]:

The streets **marked in pink on the map** are reserved for resident-only parking (ROP) with an AT issued permit and for vehicles displaying an approved visitor parking pass (see below for more information). These roads are also clearly signposted prior to and on event day.

Parking restrictions are enforced by Auckland Transport. Please call AT on (09) 355 3553 or alternatively hotline on (09) 815 4820 if you have any concerns.

Resident-Only Parking (ROP) Scheme [5:30pm – 9:30pm]:

The ROP is in place for residents who require on-street parking on the day of the event. Between the hours indicated above, only vehicles with a valid parking permit (either registered digitally with AT or displaying a physical residents parking permit or AT visitor pass) can park on the streets in the ROP area.

Please note, even with a valid resident-only parking permit or approved visitor pass, you may be ticketed or towed if you choose to park in areas that are identified as no parking, mobility parking, or authorised parking.

How to get a parking permit:

- **Permanent Residents-only Parking Permit:** Residents can apply for a permanent parking permit from Auckland Transport. Scan the QR code to access the AT Eden Park Parking Permit page. If you have a physical parking permit please ensure it is visible in your vehicle to avoid being ticketed or towed.
- **Visitor Parking Pass:** Guests will require a temporary visitor parking permit to park on the streets within the ROP. These can be collected from Eden Park Reception (Gate G) Monday – Friday 8am – 5pm or on the event day and must be clearly displayed in the vehicle. Please bring proof of your address dated within the last two months.



Toilets & Rubbish Bins:

Additional rubbish bins and temporary toilet facilities will be placed in the area. Clean up will be undertaken during the event and the following morning.

Please note, changes to the Traffic Management Plan may be required on event day for public safety reasons.
